**A28 ASHFORD ROAD,
BETHERSDEN, ASHFORD**

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2020

To allow essential carriageway resurfacing works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of A28 Ashford Road, Bethersden, near Ashford.

Overnight closures are currently planned from Friday 22 May 2020 with completion expected by the night of 12 June 2020.

Closures are weekday nights (excluding the Bank Holiday) from 19:30 hours through until approximately 05:00 hours each night.

A28 Ashford Road will be closed in phases between the junctions with Bull Lane and Standard Lane, to the actual extent indicated at any time by signs and barriers on site.

~ There will be no direct access between Ashford and Tenterden during these works ~

The alternative route for through traffic is via A28 Ashford Road, Church Hill, Woodchurch Road, Plurenden Road, Bethersden Road and Woodchurch Road back to A28 Ashford Road

There will be an additional need to close Bull Lane on 2 nights at different stages during these works, with the dates signposted and notified locally.

Bull Lane will be closed at the junction with A28 Ashford Road to allow works to be carried out across the junction.

The alternative route for Bull Lane is via A28 Ashford Road, School Road, Wissenden Lane, Norton Lane, Pluckley Road, Chambers Green Road, Smarden Road, Rose Farm Road, The Pinnock, Bell Lane, Smarden Bell Road, Burnthouse Lane, Biddenden Road, Bethersden Road and Smarden Road back to Bull Lane

Personnel will be on site to allow managed access for residents and businesses when it is safe to do so, but there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons
